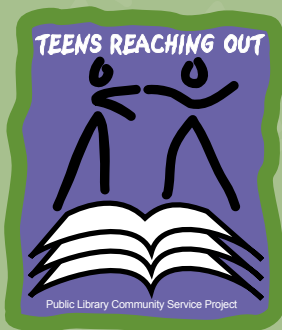

Do you know a teen who needs practical work experience and job skills?

Your local public library has a teen community service program that can help. At the library, the teen will have a volunteer work experience under the guidance of trained professionals.

Some of the opportunities the program can provide include:

- Advising the library staff on ways to make the library a better place for teens

The library's teen community service program has been designed to ensure that the young participants acquire some of the functional skills needed for effective work performance as identified by the U.S. Department of Labor's Secretary's Commission on Achieving Necessary Skills. These include resource management, information management, social interaction, systems behavior and performance, human and technology interaction and affective skills such as attitudes, motivation, and values.
